- Mr. Nikola DOBROSLAVIC (Croatia): President of Dubrovnik-Neretva Region, COTER and CIVEX rapporteur, President of Adriatic Ionian Euroregion.
 - Dubrovnik-Neretva County is the southernmost county of Adriatic Croatia, characterized by a narrow and inhomogeneous coastal zone, lakes, rivers and the Neretva Delta. In the framework of the Interreg Italy-Croatia WATERCARE, water management solutions for reducing microbial environmental impact in coastal areas have been installed in the Neretva Delta.
- Ms. Vedrana ILIC (Serbia): Representative of the International Commission for the Protection of the Danube River, Serbia's Assistant Minister responsible for international relations at the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Water Management.

(ICPDR) is an international organization consisting of 15 members and one of the largest and most active international river basin management bodies in the world. Their mission is to promote and coordinate **sustainable and equitable water management**, including conservation, improvement and rational use of waters for the benefit of the Danube River Basin countries and their people.

Mr. Bardh SPAHIA (Albania): Mayor of Shkodër.

The City of Shkodër is characterized by the proximity to the largest lake in Southern Europe. The Municipality is associated partner of the project ALMONIT-MTC, which helps monitor the quality of marine waters, while a new pilot multimodal transport on the Lake will connect Albania with Montenegro.













Mr. Svemir GORIN (North Macedonia): Associate professor of Geographic information systems at Faculty of Natural Sciences and Mathematics at University of Skopje, Vice President of Geobalcanica. He is one of the authors of "Water Resources Management in the Republic of North Macedonia".
